



Panel III : Gender perspectives in Economic and Technical Cooperation

Recommendations :

1. In response to the inclusive growth strategy proposed by the 2009 APEC Ministerial Meeting and Leaders' Meeting, economic and technical cooperation should concentrate on developing human resources, improving the difficult position of minority faces, striking a balance between work and life and making resources such as education, training, funds, technology and public structures readily available for women.
2. For economic and technical cooperation, it is best to combine training and application, especially information and skill training should conglomerate employment orientation to develop professional and leadership potential for women.
3. We should assist SMEs to penetrate into international market, especially help female entrepreneurs to obtain capital and technology upgrading for market demands.
4. For economic and technological cooperation projects endorsed, it should focus on women and children with special aid plan, and establish build-up and accompaniment projects based on knowledge and trust through voluntary cooperation action by NGOs internationally.
5. We should formulate incentive measures for social enterprises with taxation privilege to encourage women to involve in social enterprise for developing local economic model and enhancing opportunity of employment.
6. The education of green knowledge and technology for women should be strengthened to facilitate inclusive growth of environment and economy while most women play the role of making a significant effort on food security and promotion of green environment.
7. Women and children are oftentimes the primary victims in disaster. Under the impact of climate change, prevention and rescue cooperation for women and children should be strengthened internationally.
8. It is fundamental to have the evaluation system of female participation in economy, and make the benefit of addressing gender perspectives within economy for gender equality.
